Chard CommuniTea Waffle

A major scheme that will strengthen Chard Reservoir's barrier and help protect local communities from its potential to flood is due to get underway. Somerset Council is budgeting up to £831,000 for the work with a further £160,000 held for contingencies, having awarded the contract to Kier. The project involves building

A low wall along one section of the reservoir to reduce the risk of the reservoir failing. In the worst case scenario this could lead to severe flooding downstream, potential loss of life and multi-million pound damages.



Currently the chance of flood waters overflowing and leading to failure of the dam in any given year is approximately 1 in 5,000. With the wall in place, this chance reduces to about 1 in 400,000. The scheme will be phased with work on culverts taking place before Christmas with the wall and stabilisation works likely to start in the New Year.
